Keryn Chalmers, Deputy Dean, Monash Business School

Keryn has extensive experience in Higher Education in various leadership and governance roles. She was Dean of School of Business, Law, and Entrepreneurship at Swinburne University from 2016, until her retirement in late 2023. Prior to that, she had spent nearly twenty years at Monash Business School where she had responsibility for portfolios such as Accreditation, International and Engagement. In 2024 she returned to Monash Business School on a part-time basis, where she is current a Deputy Dean.

During her academic career, Keryn has been President, Australian Business Deans Council and Australian President of the Accounting and Finance Association of Australia. Internationally she has served as President of the International Association for Accounting Education and Research and a member of the International Accounting Education Standards Board, contributing to the development and implementation of global accounting education standards.
