Our Guest Speakers

Professor Christine Cooper



Christine Cooper is a Chair in Accounting at the University of Edinburgh Business School, Scotland, United Kingdom. She holds a PhD in Accounting from the University of Strathclyde and a Masters of Accounting and Finance from the London School of Economics. Her research is broadly concerned with the impact of accounting in our everyday lives. This broad interdisciplinary arena has two dominant strands. The first is concerned with the probably unanswerable question - why do we do what we do. In terms of accounting this would mean considering how accounting information or accounting's theoretical frameworks impact upon our decision making or actions. The second closely related strand is concerned with the wider economic and social impact of accounting on people's lives.

Professor Cooper has published widely on diverse topics including taxation, auditing, privatisation, gender, social impact bonds, accountability and annual reports. Her latest research is concerned with accounting's role as a technology within the neoliberal architecture of government. She is the coeditor-in-chief of *Critical Perspectives on Accounting* and joint-editor in chief of *Accountancy Business and the Public Interest Journal*. She also sits on the editorial boards of other accounting journals including top tiered journals such as *Accounting Organizations and Society, Accounting Auditing and Accountability Journal and Accounting Forum*. She has previously held academic appointments at the University of Strathclyde and Middlesex University.

Professor Dr. C.M.L (Niels) Hermes



Niels Hermes is Professor of International Finance and Chair of the Department of Economics, Econometrics and Finance of the Faculty of Economics and Business, University of Groningen, the Netherlands. He holds a PhD in Economics and a Masters in Economics from the University of Groningen, and is a Visiting Professor at Solvay Business School, Universite Libre de Bruxelles. His research interests are in corporate governance, international finance and sustainable finance. He has published on these topics in journals such as Economic Journal, Corporate Governance: An International Review, World Development, Journal of International Money and Finance, Journal of Economic Surveys and Journal of Banking and Finance.

With respect to corporate governance, Professor Hermes' work revolves around questions related to the corporate board structure, board effectiveness, comparative analyses of corporate governance systems, and the governance of non-profit organizations. He is editor of *Corporate Governance: An International Review* and associate editor of *Corporate Ownership and Control*. He is member of the research team for the research project Delivering Inclusive Financial Development and Growth, financed by ESRC-DFID, UK.
